



Coach's Code of Conduct

The function of a coach is to ensure a positive baseball experience for all players regardless of ability. Coaches serve as an advisor, mentor, lifeline, or simply as a person to lend an ear and listen. The role that a coach can have on a player's life is significant in youth development. The sports field offers a place to develop both as an athlete and individual, and lessons learned on that field will be carried throughout life. Each player should be treated with the utmost respect, and his or her welfare should be considered in decisions by the coach at all times.

Thank you for your willingness to volunteer as a coach. You are the face of Pullman Youth Baseball Association. Accordingly, the following Coaches Code of Conduct has been adopted by the Pullman Youth Baseball Association. By completing the registration process as a coach you agree to all terms set forth therein.

Speed Limit 5 mph in roadways and parking lots while attending any PYBA function. Watch for small children around parked cars.

No Alcohol allowed in any parking lot, field, or common areas within the PYBA fields.

No SMOKING or Tobacco products of any kind (including spit tobacco) allowed in any common areas.

No Playing in parking lots at any time.

No Playing on and around lawn/maintenance equipment.

No Profanity allowed in any parking lot, field, or common areas.

No Swinging Bats or throwing baseballs at any time within the walkways and common areas.

No throwing balls against dugouts or against backstop.

No throwing rocks and no climbing fences.

Only a player on the field and at bat, may swing a bat.

Observe all posted signs. Players and spectators should be alert at all times for foul balls and errant throws.

During game, players must remain in the dugout area in an orderly fashion at all times.

After each game, each team must clean up trash in dugout and around stands.

All gates to the field must remain closed at all times.

After players have entered or left the playing field, gates should be closed and secured.

Failure to comply with the above may result in removal from Pullman Youth Baseball Association
